National Cabinet

Australia's premier interjurisdictional body, providing governments with a forum to work collaboratively on issues of national significance. Members include the Prime Minister, Premiers and Chief Ministers.

A representative of local government will be invited to meet with National Cabinet once each year, acknowledging the role it has in productivity.
